Our Internship

CRES Forum's Advocacy Intern will have the opportunity to work on a myriad of projects to advance the organization's public affairs, engagement, and advocacy goals. A typical day could include coordinating with trade associations on an upcoming event, drafting content for social media or CRES Forum's blog, and attending an industry event on behalf of the CRES Forum team.

This is a paid internship and will result in a significant professional learning experience in Washington, DC public affairs as well as important career contacts. Work hours are flexible based on availability but a 35-40-hour work week is ideal.
