



**Voters want**

A 2023 CRES Forum nationwide survey reveals that Republican and Independent voters **strongly support federal legislative action** to address **climate change**, support U.S. **clean energy development**, strengthen American **leadership**, and reduce **global emissions**.

## **67% of Republicans & Independents**

Say it is important for their Member of Congress to work to  
**address climate change.**



### **90% of Republicans & 91% of Independents**

Support policies that utilize nature, such as planting trees, to **capture and store carbon** from the atmosphere.



### **81% of Republicans & 75% of Independents**

Support policies that allow U.S. natural gas producers to meet global demand by **exporting American natural gas**, which is better for the climate than natural gas produced in places like Russia.

## **70% of Republicans & Independents**

Support the federal government taking action to **expand the use of clean energy** in the United States.



### **81% of Republicans & 78% of Independents**

Support policies that **speed up government review** of energy infrastructure project applications to allow projects to be built faster.



### **88% of Republicans & 86% of Independents**

Support policies that make it **easier to develop** the American minerals and resources that are necessary for clean energy production in the U.S. and our allied countries.

The CRES Forum survey was conducted March 8-9, 2023, by Moore Information Group. A total of 1,000 online interviews were conducted among a nationwide representative sample of self-identifying Republican and Independent voters. The potential sampling error is plus or minus 3% at the 95% confidence level.
