

2023 Nationwide Survey Permitting Reform



Permitting reform is essential for clean energy development.

CRES Forum 2023 polling shows **Republicans and Independents** support permitting and regulatory reform policies that **prioritize America's domestic resources**, **reduce reliance on foreign adversaries** like China, and **lower greenhouse gas emissions**.



Support policies that speed up government review of energy infrastructure applications to allow projects to be built faster.

Many of the **critical minerals** needed to produce consumer goods such as smart phones and many modern military technologies, as well as **renewable technologies** such as **solar** and **wind** energy, **batteries** for energy storage and **electric vehicles** are extracted and processed in **China**.

The CRES Forum survey was conducted March 8-9, 2023, by Moore Information Group. A total of 1,000 online interviews were conducted among a nationwide representative sample of self-identifying Republican and Independent voters. The potential sampling error is plus or minus 3% at the 95% confidence level.
